Re: Council Housekeeping Report

1. The Street Improvement Millage work on Garfield from Allen Road to Rosedale Avenue is nearly complete, with just the final grade and clean-up left to finish. The contractor is working on the Niver Avenue storm drain and has poured a large section of concrete roadway from just south of Englewood to about the mid-point between Leslie and Wick.
2. The HVAC Replacement Project at the Fire Station started yesterday, July 11th. The bids for the Exhaust Removal System are due Thursday, July 21st.
3. As of yesterday at 8:00 AM, the Fire Chief lifted the Open Burning Ban.
4. The Community Build playground at Boccabella Park was very successful. Special thanks to the Allen Park Citizens Civic Fund, Lowe's – Allen Park, C. E. Raines, Buccilli Group, and Great Lakes ACE – Allen Park.
5. The new Zamboni Ice Resurfacers for the ice arena was delivered on June 28th.
6. Cardio Drumming has expanded from one evening per week to two, and is now available on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
7. The LED Streetlight Conversion Project for Southfield Road is scheduled to start on Monday, July 18th. The conversion project in various areas of the

City is nearly 50% complete, as the contractor, Corby Energy, is changing Mercury Vapor lights to LED Lights.

8. The Allen Road Pavement Striping in the downtown area will be started this Saturday morning. If necessary, they will finish on Sunday.
9. Work on the Watson Street Pump Station will start the first part of August.
10. Design work is being done for the water mains on Arlington and Warwick streets.
11. The City received notification that we will be receiving a Surface Urban Transportation Grant for Enterprise Drive – I-94 to Oakwood Boulevard. The project will be part of FY 2018 and the City's contribution requirement will be approximately 19%.
12. Time Equities sold 13.84 acres on Enterprise Drive to Ford. Per the Land Contract Agreement, the City received 65% of the net proceeds, or just a little less than \$2 million.
13. The \$16,750,000.00 bond sale closed on June 29th.
