SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- As of July 7, 2022 there are 666 (20.7%) counties districts or territories with a high COVID-19 Community Level, 1,218 (37.8%) counties with a medium Community Level and 1,331 (41.3%) counties with a low Community Level. —CDC
- Wayne County** and majority of State of MI community level is **Low**.

- Wash your hands often. Use soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If you do not have soap and water use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. —CDC
- New variants of a virus happen because the virus that causes COVID-19 constantly changes through a natural ongoing process of mutation (change). As the virus spreads, it has more opportunities to change. High vaccination coverage in a population reduces the spread of the virus and helps prevent new variants from emerging. —CDC
- COVID-19 vaccine boosters can further enhance or restore protection that might have decreased over time after your primary series vaccination. —CDC
- You are considered up-to-date if you have completed your primary series but are not yet eligible for a booster. You have received 1 booster but are not recommended to get a 2nd booster. You have received 1 booster but are not yet eligible for a 2nd booster. —CDC
- Not all places that offer adult vaccines, like pharmacies, are able to vaccinate young children. COVID-19 vaccines for young children are primarily administered at health departments and pediatrician offices, so it's always a good idea to call ahead to schedule an appointment. —CDC
- If you test positive for COVID-19 or if you have been exposed it is important that you immediately take steps to get the care you need and avoid giving COVID-19 to people around you -Contagious: You can be contagious two days before symptoms appear (or two days before test date if positive and no symptoms) through the end of the isolation period. —MDHHS
- Globally, the number of weekly COVID-19 cases has increased for the third consecutive week, after a declining trend was observed since the last peak in March 2022. During the week of 20 to 26 June 2022, over 4.1 million cases were reported, an 18% increase as compared to the previous week . —WHO
