## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Additional cases of B.1.1.7. have been identified in two adult females living in Washtenaw County who were in close contact with the first person in Michigan to be diagnosed with the COVID-19 variant. All three individuals are associated with the University of Michigan. — **Michigan.gov**
- On his first full day in office, President Joe Biden released details Thursday (Jan. 21) of his sweeping plan to combat the coronavirus, announcing 10 executive orders and directing agencies to use wartime powers to require U.S. companies to make N95 masks, swabs and other equipment to fight the pandemic. The president's plan emphasizes ramping up testing for the coronavirus, accelerating the pace of vaccinations and providing more funding and direction to state and local officials.—**CNBC**
- Michigan officials say bars and restaurants can resume indoor dining on Feb. 1, ending a nearly two months pause. A sustained decrease in new coronavirus cases and positive rates is ending the ban on indoor dining, but the state will announce restrictions on service on Friday, said Robert Gordon, director of MDHHS. "While restaurants will be reopening on that day, there will continue to be risk associated with indoor dining," Gordon said.—**Bridge Michigan**
- The one-dose COVID vaccine being developed by Johnson & Johnson could dramatically speed up the fight against the pandemic. Results from clinical trials of the new vaccine – developed and produced by Johnson & Johnson's Janssen division – are expected by the end of this month. The vaccine could become the third authorized by the FDA. Johnson & Johnson had promised 1 billion doses of its vaccine to the U.S. government by the end of the year.—**USA Today**
