SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced that Saniderm Products and UVT Inc. have agreed on a voluntary recall of their hand sanitizer due to the potential presence of methanol (wood alcohol), a substance that can be toxic when absorbed through the skin or ingested.
- The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has approved two Lysol products—Lysol Disinfectant Spray and Lysol Disinfectant Max Cover Mistas effective against the novel coronavirus when used on hard, non-porous surfaces. The two products are the first to have been tested directly against the virus and proved effective by killing the virus two minutes after contact.
- The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has established emergency staffing for short-term, immediate support to long-term care facilities facing acute staffing crises due to COVID-19. Rapid Response Staffing Resources will be available in 11 counties — Kent, Ottawa, Allegan, Muskegon, Newago, Montcalm, Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Livingston and Washtenaw.
- In response to the economic impact of COVID-19, the State of Michigan has appropriated \$15 million of federal CARES Act funding through SB 690, signed into law by Governor Whitmer last week, to implement the [Michigan Agricultural Safety Grant Program](#). These grants will provide much needed funding to Michigan's agricultural processors and farms in support of this critical industry in the state.
- Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel announced that Michigan is partnering with California, Maine, New Mexico, Wisconsin and the District of Columbia to challenge a new rule issued by Education Secretary Betsy DeVos that runs contrary to the law for distributing CARES Act funding to schools.
