## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- A report on how COVID-19 cases spread rapidly through a summer camp in Georgia suggests kids transmit the virus very well. Nearly 600 young campers and counselors attended the camp in late June, and of the 344 who were tested for COVID-19, 76% tested positive by mid-July. Three-quarters of the COVID-19 cases involved symptoms including sore throat, headache, and fever. Campers averaged 12 years of age and hadn't been required to wear masks although camp staff wore masks. The camp was quickly disbanded and it closed on June 27th.
- Russian officials say they intend to be the first in the world to approve a COVID-19 vaccine—despite concerns about its safety, effectiveness and over whether the country has cut essential corners in development. The officials state that they are working toward a date of August 10 or earlier for approval of the vaccine, which has been created by the Moscow-based Gamaleya Institute. It will be approved for public use, with frontline healthcare workers getting it first.
- Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Director Robert Gordon has issued an [Emergency Order](#) requiring COVID-19 testing for agricultural and food processing employees. The order makes Michigan a national leader in COVID-19 safety protections for agricultural and migrant workers, building on Executive Orders from Governor Whitmer requiring workplace safety measures in meat and poultry processing plants and safe housing for COVID positive migrant workers.
- To protect employees, customers and communities from the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) launched a State Emphasis Program (SEP) focused on retail, restaurant, bar and service industry establishments that addresses the need for increased partnership, education and enforcement to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spread.
