SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The Michigan Economic Development Corporation has awarded an additional \$4.7 million in low-interest loans to 71 small businesses in 15 counties across Michigan through the [Michigan Small Business Relief Program](#). The Michigan Small Business Relief Program was authorized by the Michigan Strategic Fund in March of this year to provide relief for small businesses negatively impacted by the COVID-19 crisis. Loans through the program are intended to support small businesses facing drastic reductions in cash flow and the continued support of their workforce and may be used for working capital to support payroll expenses, rent, mortgage payments, utility expenses, or other similar expenses that occur in the ordinary course of business.
- Students at Michigan State University (MSU) are being asked to [self-quarantine](#) as coronavirus (COVID-19) cases continue to rise throughout the community. According to officials, at least 342 people who are affiliated with the university have tested positive for COVID-19 since Aug. 24. Officials say that students can leave quarantine to attend in-person instruction, labs and athletic training, as well as to work or obtain food, medicine, medical care and other essential supplies. The Ingham County Health Department says self-quarantine is a recommendation and not an executive order. However, students should expect "more stringent and mandatory restrictions" if they do not practice self-quarantine and successfully break the transmission cycle, officials said.
- The University of Oxford and AstraZeneca Plc have restarted a U.K. trial of an experimental Covid-19 [vaccine](#) after it was halted over concerns about a participant who fell ill. The U.K. Medicines Health Regulatory Authority recommended that the study resume after an independent review of the safety data triggered a pause on Sept. 6, Oxford said in a statement. It declined to disclose details about the volunteer's illness.
