## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- San Diego County public health officials gave residents a glimpse of actions the county could take if COVID-19 cases begin to spike as a result of public demonstrations and newly opened industries, up to and including dialing back reopenings. Supervisor Nathan Fletcher identified 13 "triggers" that could cause the county to take industry-specific actions, pause all reopening efforts or even dial back reopenings. These triggers are divided into three categories: epidemiology and public health, with four triggers each -- and healthcare, with five.
- The Trump administration has selected five companies as the most likely candidates to produce a vaccine. The five companies are Moderna, a Massachusetts-based biotechnology firm, which Dr. Fauci said he expected would enter into the final phase of clinical trials next month; the combination of Oxford University and AstraZeneca, on a similar schedule; and three large pharmaceutical companies: Johnson & Johnson, Merck and Pfizer. Each is taking a somewhat different approach.
- The United Kingdom has launched a trial aimed at reducing COVID-19 related respiratory failure thus reducing the need for aggressive intervention such as ventilation. The trial consists of a unique formulation of the ibuprofen drug that would be given at a "very specific stage" of the virus to the hospitalized COVID-19 patients.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-113](#), which continues to allow certain state administrative hearings to be held by video conference or phone in place of in-person hearings. This order is effective immediately and remains in effect through June 30, 2020.
- More than 100 small businesses around Michigan will utilize the Michigan Economic Development Corporation's MI Local Biz crowdfunding program throughout the month of June, MEDC announced today. MEDC will provide a total of \$500,000 in matching grants to help the businesses as they work to recover from the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 crisis.

- Wayne Co. Public Health is coordinating with Long-Term Care Facilities on obtaining Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), testing and reporting statistics.
- Wayne Co. Public Health is preparing mitigation strategies for a second wave of COVID-19.
