SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The D.C. area's economy had just begun to open back up when George Floyd died in Minneapolis. The medical examiner's office in the county has ruled his death a homicide. The dayslong mass protests that have followed — combined with already loosened stay-at-home orders across the region — will almost certainly spread COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Orders [2020-114](#) and [2020-115](#) to reopen more regions and economic sectors under the [MI Safe Start Plan](#). Starting on June 10, Regions 6 and 8 will advance to Phase 5. Phase 5 allows the reopening of salons, movie theaters, and gyms, subject to safety protocols and procedures designed to minimize the spread of COVID-19. On June 15, personal services including hair, massages, and nails will reopen statewide. Though the remaining regions, 1 through 5 and 7, will remain in Phase 4, the governor has said she expects the entire state will advance to Phase 5 in the coming weeks.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-116](#), which extends her previous Executive Order [2020-79](#), lifting certain requirements of the application process for young Michiganders to obtain a work permit.
- The Michigan National Guard will continue its partnership with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Michigan State Police, and local health departments to offer COVID-19 testing this weekend in the communities of Holland, Ferndale, Battle Creek, Sturgis, Allegan, and Petoskey.
- Governor Whitmer appointed Sean Egan to serve as Director of COVID-19 Workplace Safety. In addition to this role, Egan also serves as Deputy Director for Labor at the Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) where he oversees MIOSHA, Workers' Disability Compensation Agency, the Bureau of Employment Relations and the Wage and Hour Division.
