### SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Wayne County is currently in **MEDIUM** overall community levels. Wear a mask indoors and on public transportation. See Wayne County Covid-19 webpage for further recommendation [www.waynecounty.com/COVID19dashboard](http://www.waynecounty.com/COVID19dashboard)
- It takes several weeks after each dose of COVID-19 vaccine for your body to develop maximum levels of immunity, you are not protected right away. It still is not known exactly how long protection from COVID-19 vaccines lasts but most people have strong protection against serious illness and death for at least 6 months —**WHO**
- SARS-CoV-2 infection is transmitted predominantly by inhalation of respiratory droplets generated when people cough, sneeze, sing, talk, or breathe. CDC recommends community use of masks to prevent transmission of SARS-CoV-2 —**CDC**
- Masks are primarily intended to reduce the emission of virus-laden droplets by the wearer “source control” which is especially relevant for asymptomatic or pre-symptomatic infected wearers who feel well and may be unaware of their infectiousness to others (estimated to account for more than 50% of SARS-CoV-2 transmissions. Masks also help reduce inhalation of these droplets by the wearer (“filtration for wearer protection”). The community benefit of masking for SARS-CoV-2 control is due to the combination of these two effects (source control and filtration for wearer protection) individual prevention benefit increases with increasing numbers of people using masks consistently and correctly —**CDC**
- If you have COVID-19 you can spread the virus to others. There are precautions you can take to prevent spreading it to others: isolation, masking, and avoiding contact with people who are at high risk of getting very sick. Isolation is used to separate people with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 from those without COVID-19 —**CDC**
