SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Beijing is reintroducing strict lockdown measures and rolling out mass testing after a fresh cluster of novel coronavirus cases emerged from the city's largest wholesale food market, sparking fears of a resurgence of the deadly outbreak.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-127](#), which extends the state of emergency declaration related to the COVID-19 pandemic until July 16. In doing so, Governor Whitmer joins nearly every state in the country in maintaining a state of emergency to cope with the COVID-19 pandemic. This executive order will allow her to continue taking action to protect Michigan families and workers.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-128](#), which clarifies the Workers' Disability Compensation Act (WDCA) eligibility for workplace exposure to COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-129](#), which extends a previous Executive Order allowing public bodies to conduct public meetings remotely during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Executive Order 2020-129 expires on July 31, 2020.
- The Michigan National Guard will continue its partnership with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Michigan State Police State Emergency Operations Center, and local health departments to offer no-cost COVID-19 testing this Friday, June 19, in Alpena, Baraga, Ogemaw, and Tawas counties.
- Governor Whitmer signaled her support for SB 690 which puts more than \$850 million in federal Coronavirus Relief Fund monies into action across the state. The supplemental budget bill includes \$120 million for direct care workers, providing an additional \$2/hour from now through September to ensure direct care workers receive additional money, and it provides \$125 million in day care subsidies to reduce child care costs for families right now.
- European scientists conducted a genetic analysis comparing 2,000 severe COVID-19 patients to several others who were healthy or had mild to no symptoms. The study suggested that those with type A blood were more likely to suffer from severe disease and those with type O blood were less likely.
