## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Health officials continue to warn governments and citizens to maintain caution when reopening economies.
  - Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, the director-general of the World Health Organization (WHO), stated that only a “slow, steady lifting of lockdowns” could ease economic pains while keeping infections at bay and that social distancing restrictions were still the best weapons against the virus. WHO officials warned that ignoring precautions would inevitably lead to more infections.
  - Dr. Anthony Fauci, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, cautioned the Senate Health Committee that if the country reopened prematurely, “the consequences could be really serious.”
  - Dr. Robert R. Redfield, the director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, warned the Senate Health Committee that “we are not out of the woods yet.”
- Former State Senator Morris Hood III, who served the State Senate for District 3 from 2010-2018, as well as three (3) terms in the State House of Representatives for District 11, has lost his battle from COVID-19 at the age of 54.
- Officials in Wuhan, China have stated all 11 million residents of Wuhan will be tested due to six (6) new cases being confirmed this week.
- Although Germany implemented an aggressive program of testing and tracing infections when it eased restrictions last week, it is now beginning to see an increase in new cases.
