## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- COVID-19 Community Levels for Wayne County, MI are currently Low. Community Levels are determined based on the number of occupied hospital beds, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. —CDC
- To date more than 6.6 million Michiganders ages 5 and up have gotten at least their first dose of one of
  the three safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines. Eligible Michiganders are encouraged to stay up to date
  on vaccinations, including booster doses that provide extra protection, residents of long-term care
  facilities where outbreaks can spread quickly and extra protection is strongly recommended. —MDHHS
- MDHHS continues to recommend the use of layered mitigation strategies for Michiganders, including vaccination, masks, testing, and isolation and quarantine as needed. —MDHHS
- People who are up to date on vaccinations have much lower risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19 compared with unvaccinated people. –CDC
   CDC recommends everyone ages 12 years and older receive a COVID-19 vaccine booster after
- completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series. Some people can receive two boosters. —CDC
- As of 20 March 2022, over 468 million confirmed cases and over 6 million deaths have been reported globally. —WHO
- The Multilateral Leaders Task Force, which includes the heads of the International Monetary Fund, World Bank Group, World Health Organization, and World Trade Organization, held consultations with international organizations and vaccine leaders aimed at increasing vaccine production and delivery. In a statement, the task force called on vaccine manufacturers, international organizations, and countries to work together to share knowledge and resources to increase equitable access to vaccines, testing, and treatment for COVID-19. —WHO
