## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Governor Whitmer announced updates to the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (MIOSHA) [COVID-19 emergency rules](#) as many employers return to in-person work. The governor also announced an updated MDHHS COVID-19 Gatherings and Face Masks epidemic order, eliminating outdoor capacity limits and increasing indoor social gatherings to 50% capacity, which takes effect today, June 1.—**Michigan.gov**
- Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine is safe and highly effective in children ages 12 to 17, the company said Tuesday (May 25). It would be the second COVID-19 vaccine available for the age group if it is authorized for use, in addition to the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine. Two options would "increase the supply and choices of vaccines available to younger people," said Dr. Richard Besser, president of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, who is a former acting director of the CDC.—**NBC News**
- In 25 states, the District of Columbia and Guam, more than half of adults are now fully vaccinated against COVID-19, according to the CDC. New England leads the U.S. in vaccination rates among adults. Maine, Connecticut and Vermont have the highest vaccination rates among adults, with more than 62% of residents age 18 and over fully vaccinated.—**NPR**
- The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced Tuesday (May 25) that it is designating \$4.8 billion to provider relief funding for COVID-19 testing for uninsured people in the U.S. The administration intends the funding from the American Rescue Plan to ensure the approximately 29 million uninsured U.S. residents have access to COVID-19 testing in order to track where the virus is prevalent for appropriate responses.—**The Hill**
