SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Wayne County is currently in **HIGH** overall community levels
- Wear a mask indoors and on public transportation; see Wayne County Covid-19 webpage for further recommendation www.waynecounty.com/COVID19dashboard
- Current data suggest that BA.4 and BA.5 spread more easily than previous Omicron lineages and have been on the rise for weeks. BA.5 is predominant in the United States—**CDC**
- Novavax is a new vaccine type is protein subunit (2 dose primary series given 3–8 weeks apart) 3rd primary dose not yet authorized—**CDC**
- CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines for everyone 6 months and older and boosters for everyone 5 years and older if eligible—**CDC**
- 67.6% of MI residents have received 1+ vaccine dose As of 7/20/22—**MDHHS**
- New variants of a virus happen because the virus that causes COVID-19 constantly changes through a natural ongoing process of mutation (change). As the virus spreads it has more opportunities to change. High vaccination coverage in a population reduces the spread of the virus and helps prevent new variants from emerging—**CDC**
- FDA released a statement revising its Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) limiting the authorized use of the Janssen (J&J) COVID-19 vaccine —**MDHHS**
- Based on investigation the FDA determined that the risk of thrombosis with thrombocytopenia syndrome (TTS) warrants limiting the authorized use of the vaccine. TTS syndrome is a rare and potentially life-threatening blood clots in combination with low levels of blood platelets. TTS linked with the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine most frequently presented within 10 days—2 weeks following vaccine administration —**MDHHS**
- If you test positive for COVID-19 or if you have been exposed it is important that you immediately take steps to get the care you need and avoid giving COVID-19 to people around you. A person can be contagious two days before symptoms appear (or two days before test date if positive and no symptoms) through the end of the isolation period—**MDHHS**
