SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- CDC Director, Robert Redfield, has warned that a second wave of COVID-19 could coincide with flu season, which is responsible for thousands of American deaths per year. He states that this could overwhelm and under-supply the nation's health care system even further than it had during the current COVID-19 outbreak.
- On Friday, the FDA has allowed for the emergency use of Remdesivir, an experimental drug that has helped some COVID-19 patients recover faster. A study from Gilead Sciences, the biopharmaceutical that produces the drug, has shown that Remdesivir shortens recovery time by 31% (about four (4) days) on average for hospitalized COVID-19 patients.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following executive orders:
 - [2020-70](#): which rescinded order [2020-59](#) and now allows another segment of previously suspended work to be resumed on 5/7/2020. This includes construction, real-estate activities, and work that is primarily performed outdoors.
 - [2020-71](#): which extends existing safety measures in executive order [2020-60](#), to protect consumers and employees at grocery stores and pharmacies until 5/29/2020.
 - [2020-72](#): which replaces the governor's previous order [2020-37](#), renewing the restrictions on entry into care facilities to protect vulnerable populations from COVID-19. This order additionally requires employees of these facilities to wear face coverings while at work.
- Michigan has been approved by the U.S. Department of Education (USED) for nearly \$390 million (USD) in federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds. The funds provide relief to schools across the U.S. to address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.
