SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- North Dakota election officials say Republican candidate David Andahl, who died on Oct. 5th
 after he had been sick with COVID-19 for several days, won a seat as state representative for
 District 8 on Nov. 3rd. Andahl, 55, remained on the ballot, in part because early voting had
 begun weeks before his death.—USA Today
- The West Bloomfield School District is going fully remove for all students after health officials
 moved Oakland County to the highest risk level for spreading COVID-19 through in-person
 instruction. Last week, the Oakland County Health Division changed the county's COVID-19
 risk determination level to an E. Level E risk means there are 150 or more cases per million
 people and a 20% or higher positivity rate.—Click on Detroit
- Governor Whitmer announced that the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is making Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million available to eligible small businesses, agricultural cooperatives, and nonprofits impacted by excessive rain that occurred Oct. 1, 2019 through June 3, 2020.—Michigan.gov
- Moderna is prepping for the global launch of its potential coronavirus vaccine, already taking
 in \$1.1 billion in deposits from governments awaiting the potentially lifesaving drug, the
 biotech firm said in a recent report. The biotech company said late October it had completed
 enrollment for its 30,000 participants late-stage trial.—CNBC
