SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The more transmissible Delta variant has spread to almost every state in the US, fueling health experts' concerns about COVID-19 spikes. The variant is expected to become the dominant coronavirus strain in the US, the director of the CDC said. And with half the US still not fully vaccinated, doctors say it could cause a resurgence of COVID-19 in the fall - just as children too young to get vaccinated go back to school.—**CNN Health**
- Within 24 hours after Governor Whitmer announced the creation of the MI Shot To Win Sweepstakes – a lottery-style raffle that gives vaccinated Michiganders a chance to win more than \$5 million in cash and a combined total of nearly \$500,000 in college scholarships – entries began flooding in. As of Friday (July 2) at 8:00 a.m. EDT, the MI Shot to Win Sweepstakes received 464,698 applicants for the grand prizes, with 23,978 young Michiganders signed up for the scholarship drawing. The sweepstakes began Thursday (July 1) and ends on Aug. 3, 2021. Eligibility criteria for each of the drawings is at: www.MIShotToWin.com.—**Michigan.gov**
- Moderna said that blood samples from fully vaccinated individuals produced antibodies against multiple variants and that researchers measured only a “modest reduction in neutralizing titers” against the particularly virulent delta, which was first identified in India. “As we seek to defeat the pandemic, it is imperative that we are proactive as the virus evolves,” Moderna chief executive Stéphane Bancel said in a statement. “These new data are encouraging and reinforce our belief that the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine should remain protective against newly detected variants.”—**Kaiser Health News**
- Supplies of critical medical products in the Strategic National Stockpile are still well below federal targets more than 18 months after the coronavirus first emerged in the United States. The federal government has built up the stockpile significantly over the last year. There are more than 35 times more N95 respirators and 10 times more ventilators available now than at the start of the pandemic. But the nation is still short hundreds of millions — or more — surgical masks, gloves and gowns.—**Politico**
