SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- As of Oct. 24th, MDHHS reported more than 3,300 positive test results. "The data shows we are continuing to see alarming increases in the incidence of COVID-19 infections in Michigan," said Dr. Khaldun. "It is now more important than ever that people take this seriously. Wear a mask every time you are going to be around someone outside of your own household. Avoid large gatherings and maintain a safe distance from others. If rates continue like this, we risk overwhelming our hospitals and having many more Michiganders die." —**Michigan.gov**
- A possible COVID-19 outbreak at Woodhaven High School in Brownstown has put 51 students and one staff member in quarantine. The Woodhaven-Brownstown School District confirmed 3 students tested positive for COVID-19.—**Click on Detroit**
- A Dutch hospital airlifted COVID-19 patients to Germany to an intensive care unit, amid the virus surge. This was the first international airlift since the pandemic first threatened to overwhelm Dutch hospitals in the spring. Elsewhere on the continent, more than two-thirds of the people living in France were to be subject to a nightly curfew starting at midnight Oct. 23rd, hours after health authorities announced that the country had joined Spain in surpassing 1 million confirmed cases since the start of the pandemic.—**AP News**
- On Oct. 23rd, the Department of Health and Human Services released its August [contract](#) with Moderna. When announcing the deal, HHS said it was worth \$1.5 billion and would secure the first 100 million doses of the company's vaccine and the option to buy up to 400 million more. —**NPR**
