SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Countries are starting to ease the lockdown measures and there is fear in Europe of a new wave of infections towards the summer. Experts warn lower infection rates combined with higher temperatures could lead to complacency among people to respect social distancing and hygiene rules.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
 - [2020-107](#): Creating the Michigan Workforce Development Board. The Board is responsible for the development and continuous improvement of the workforce development system in Michigan.
 - [2020-108](#): Takes effect immediately and continues through June 26, 2020 — maintains visitation restrictions on health care facilities, residential care facilities, congregate care facilities, and juvenile justice facilities, but authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to gradually re-open visitation as circumstances permit.
 - [2020-109](#): Takes effect immediately and continues through June 12, 2020:
 - Customers who can medically tolerate a face covering must wear one when entering a grocery store or pharmacy.
 - Grocery stores and pharmacies must allocate at least two hours per week of shopping time for vulnerable populations.
 - If an employee tests positive for COVID-19, the business must notify other employees without infringing on private health information.
- The Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) within the Dept. of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO) launched a new online [COVID-19 Workplace Safety](#) site —the site provides guidance and a toolkit of resources to keep workplaces safe as sectors of the state's economy reopen.
- The Michigan National Guard continued to partner with the Michigan State Police State Emergency Operations Center, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, and local health departments by offering COVID-19 testing the communities of Westland, Traverse City, Flint, Albion, Mackinaw City and Midland.

ACTIONS TAKEN

- Wayne County Public Health and Michigan National Guard provided over 750 COVID-19 tests at Westland mall on Saturday and Sunday.
- The Public Health Emergency Operations Center (PHOC) is at FULL ACTIVATION.
