SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Wayne County is pleased to launch an updated COVID-19 Dashboard to share community-level data on cases and deaths for out-Wayne County residents. The dashboard may be found at www.waynecounty.com/COVID19dashboard. Please see the announcement attached to this email for more information.
- COVID-19 Community Levels for Wayne County, MI are currently Low.** Community Levels are determined based on the number of occupied hospital beds, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. —CDC
- To date more than 6.6 million Michiganders ages 5 and up have gotten at least their first dose of one of the three safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines. Eligible Michiganders are encouraged to stay up to date on vaccinations, including booster doses that provide extra protection, residents of long-term care facilities where outbreaks can spread quickly and extra protection is strongly recommended. —MDHHS
- MDHHS continues to recommend the use of layered mitigation strategies for Michiganders, including vaccination, masks, testing, and isolation and quarantine as needed. —MDHHS
- People who are up to date on vaccinations have much lower risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19 compared with unvaccinated people. —CDC
- CDC recommends everyone ages 12 years and older receive a COVID-19 vaccine booster after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series. Some people can receive two boosters. —CDC
- Take whatever vaccine is made available to you first**, even if you have already had COVID-19. It is important to be vaccinated as soon as possible once it's your turn and not wait. It is safe and effective to mix-and-match different COVID-19 vaccines —WHO
- The current COVID-19 vaccines provide **strong protection** against serious illness and death caused by the Omicron and Delta variants of the virus that causes COVID-19. **Being fully vaccinated will also help reduce the likelihood of new variants emerging.** —WHO
