SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Dr. Anthony S. Fauci, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), has warned that a second wave of the coronavirus is “inevitable”, however, the severity of it will depend on the quality of the countermeasures being placed to address this. In addition, if states begin lifting restrictions too early, the second wave could be more deadly than currently predicted.
- Michigan Legislatures stated that they would allow the state of emergency to expire at midnight. In response, Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
 - [2020-65](#): Extends and clarifies Executive Order [2020-35](#), which orders all K-12 school buildings to close for instructional purposes for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year.
 - [2020-66](#): Terminates the existing state of emergency and disaster declarations issued under the Emergency Management Act.
 - [2020-67](#): Clarifies that a state of emergency remains in effect under the Emergency Powers of the Governor Act of 1945. The order is effective immediately and continues through 5/28/2020.
 - [2020-68](#): Declares a state of emergency and a state of disaster across the State of Michigan under the Emergency Management Act of 1976. The state of emergency and state of disaster declared by this order will be effective through 5/28/2020.
 - [2020-69](#): Temporarily extends closures of theaters, bars, casinos and other places of accommodation during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- More than 100 protesters gathered at the Michigan State Capitol Building again to protest Governor Whitmer’s request to extend the state of emergency. Many protesters did not wear masks or follow social distancing guidelines, despite warnings of possible fines if safety precautions were not taken.
