## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Scientists worldwide continue to warn that countries need to prepare for a potential surge in cases that is likely to be more serious than the initial outbreak. The Academy of Medical Sciences in the United Kingdom (U.K.) has created a "reasonable worst-case scenario"—where the number of COVID-19-related hospital deaths between September 2020 and June 2021 in the U.K. could be as high as 119,900. Conditions such as asthma, heart attacks and stroke tend to worsen in colder temperatures, and some infectious diseases like influenza spread more easily, which means healthcare facilities face a greater patient load.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
  - Executive Order [2020-148](#): Extends protection for nursing home residents by maintaining strong infection control protocols in nursing homes and protects residents from eviction and employees from discriminatory action for staying home when exhibiting symptoms. The order extends through August 10, 2020.
  - Executive Order [2020-149](#): Extends the following health and safety rules for grocery stores and pharmacies, among others and continues through August 10, 2020:
    - Grocery stores and pharmacies must allocate at least two hours per week of shopping time for vulnerable populations.
    - If an employee tests positive for COVID-19, the business must notify other employees without infringing on private health information.
    - Grocery stores and pharmacies must offer accommodations to vulnerable employees, such as low-risk assignments or a leave of absence.
  - Executive Order [2020-150](#): Scales back the suspension of scope of practice laws for frontline health care workers while continuing suspension of certain licensing and certification requirements for health care professionals, life support and first aid workers, and 911 operators.
