### **SITUATIONAL AWARENESS**

- More than 20 states recently reported record-high numbers of average daily new cases, and
  cases are rising by 5% or more in 40 states, according to a CNBC analysis. Many of the states
  with the fastest growing outbreaks are those in the Midwest and West.—CNBC
- MDHHS announced a partnership with <u>IMPART Alliance</u> at Michigan State University's College
  of Osteopathic Medicine to develop infection control training for direct care workers. MDHHS
  has provided IMPART Alliance \$50,000 in COVID Relief Funding to develop the training and
  make it widely available for direct care workers (DCW) providing home and community-based
  services.—Michigan.gov
- MDHHS has issued guidance on how to travel and gather safely during the holidays. "Celebrating the holiday season with family and friends is one of our most cherished traditions," said Dr. Khaldun, chief medical executive and chief deputy for health. "Even though the way we celebrate may have to be different, the guidance issued today shows there are still many ways to spend quality time with family and friends safely during this festive season."—Michigan.gov
- AstraZeneca reported that its potential COVID-19 vaccine has produced a similar immune response in older and younger adults. "It is encouraging to see immunogenicity responses were similar between older and younger adults and that reactogenicity was lower in older adults, where the COVID-19 disease severity is higher," said an AstraZeneca spokesman. AstraZeneca CEO Pascal Soirot had previously said the drugmaker's vaccine would likely provide protection against contracting the coronavirus for about a year.—CNBC
