SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The Delta variant, which was first detected in India, now accounts for more than 6% of all infections in the United States, according to the CDC. And this highly transmissible variant may be responsible for more than 18% of cases in some Western U.S. states. The variant, also known as B.1.617.2, is spreading rapidly in the United Kingdom and has quickly become the dominant strain there, responsible for more than 60% of infections and causing surges in some parts of England.—NPR
- Parents in Canada and Europe now have two options to provide their children with a COVID-19 vaccine. Moderna announced that it has submitted authorization approval for the use of its vaccine in adolescents with both Canadian and EU health officials on Monday. In May, the company announced that the Phase II/III study of the vaccine in children ages 12-17 met its primary endpoints. The jab achieved 100% efficacy in a study that involved 2,500 patients who were observed under the same case definition in the Phase III study in adults.—EndPoints
- As the economy continues to open back up and employers strive to keep their employees, customers and communities safe from COVID-19, the State of Michigan has launched another round of funding for the Michigan COVID-19 Safety Grant Program. These grants will provide small businesses, including eligible childcare centers, matching funds of up to \$10,000 to decrease the risk of COVID-19 spread through safety and health-related equipment purchased and training.—Michigan.gov
- As the economy continues to grow, the Michigan Dept. of Labor and Economic Opportunity
 (LEO) launched a new 'Back to Work' effort to highlight programs and services that help
 businesses and their current workforce needs. The new online resource Michigan.gov/
 BackToWork centralizes programs and services aimed at helping employers fill job openings;
 provide safe, healthy work environments for workers; and address other business-related
 needs.—Michigan.gov
