SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- According to a team of Public Health investigators in Washington DC, a vaccine refusal rate greater than 10% would impede a targeted vaccination rate of between 55% and 82%, which is the early estimate for achieving herd immunity against COVID-19. Beyond those who are ineligible for the vaccine due to biological, environmental, and socio-behavioral factors, vaccine hesitancy could be a real barrier to herd immunity.
- Early-stage human trial data on a vaccine being developed by AstraZeneca and Oxford University will be published on July 20, The Lancet medical journal said on Wednesday. The vaccine candidate is already in large-scale Phase III human trials to assess whether it can protect against COVID-19, but its developers have yet to report Phase I results which would show whether it is safe and whether or not it induces an immune response.
- The Michigan National Guard will continue its partnership with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Michigan State Police State Emergency Operations Center, and local health departments to offer drive-thru COVID-19 testing this week in Alger County.
- The Michigan Community Service Commission (MCSC) announced that it will receive \$2,222,811 over three years from the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) to support volunteerism in Michigan. The funding will support organizations in their response to COVID-19 by identifying resources and collaborating regionally to meet compelling needs.
- As the Unemployment Insurance Agency (UIA) continues to respond to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the State of Michigan has selected Deloitte, a nationally recognized professional services organization, to assist the UIA with financial operations, investigations into imposter claims, and a forensic review to help in identifying fraudulent activity that can be quickly turned over to law enforcement for prosecution.
