SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The spread of the coronavirus continues to increase across all parts of England with cases doubling every nine days, according to a new study by Imperial College, putting pressure on the government to introduce more drastic lockdown restrictions. The pandemic has killed more than 45,675 people in Britain, the highest death toll in Europe. —**Reuters**
- The Northville Public Schools district superintendent sent a letter to families, students and staff on Oct. 28 explaining why more than 75 of the district's roughly 7,000 students are quarantining. In her letter, Superintendent Mary Kay Gallagher said she believes the district has had effective protocols to keep kids safe in school amid the coronavirus pandemic this fall. However, Gallagher said out-of-school parties, and in one case a party bus, without social distancing or mask-wearing put dozens of students at risk of contracting the virus. —**Click on Detroit**
- MDHHS revised and extended its [epidemic order](#) to contain the spread of COVID-19, as Michigan continues to see a surge in cases, hospitalizations, and deaths. Although most of the order is unchanged, new provisions target indoor gatherings where COVID has spread most rapidly.
- Coronavirus restrictions will need to remain in place in some form even after a vaccine becomes available, National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) Director Dr. Anthony Fauci said in a podcast. "I think it will be easily by the end of 2021 and perhaps into the next year before we start having some semblance of normality." Fauci explained that health officials "likely will get knowledge of whether or not we have safe and effective vaccines some time in December. —**Fox News Rundown**
