## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Florida experienced one of the largest spikes in new cases. The number of new cases reported each day had increased an average of roughly 46% in a single week, just as most of the state entered a second phase of reopening.
- With confirmed COVID-19 cases worldwide continuing to grow, scientists are pushing forward with efforts to develop vaccines and treatments to slow the pandemic and lessen the disease's damage. Some of the earliest treatments will likely be drugs that are already approved for other conditions, or have been tested on other viruses. "People are looking into whether existing antivirals might work or whether new drugs could be developed to try to tackle the virus," said Dr. Bruce Y. Lee, a professor at the CUNY Graduate School of Public Health & Health Policy.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-120](#), which lifts restrictions on overnight residential, travel, and troop camps beginning June 15.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-122](#), which allows for statutes of limitations to be calculated normally, beginning June 20. The executive order coincides with Michigan Supreme Court Administrative Order No. [2020-18](#).
- The Michigan National Guard continued its partnership with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Michigan State Police, and local health departments to offer COVID-19 public both Saturday, June 13 and Sunday, June 14 in Branch, Chippewa, Gratiot, Marquette, Muskegon, Newago, Schoolcraft, and Wayne counties. Testing in Wayne County occurred at Ecorse High School.
- Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin suggested the Trump administration was considering sending Americans another round of stimulus checks to offset the financial pain caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and the related economic lockdown.

- Wayne County and Michigan National Guard provided free COVID-19 tests at Ecorse High School on Saturday and Sunday.
