SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- According to data from Johns Hopkins University, weekly data trend comparison shows at least 23 states are seeing an increase in cases. Texas and Florida— one of the first states to reopen, have reported more than a 50% increase.
- The World Health Organization (WHO) warned the pandemic is accelerating. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO Director-General stated that more than 150,000 new cases were reported to WHO last Thursday, and almost half of those cases were reported from the Americas.
- On June 25, 2020, indoor Michigan gyms will be allowed to reopen due to a preliminary injunction that was granted by Grand Rapids U.S. District Judge Paul Maloney. Governor Whitmer plans to appeal this decision.
- The Unemployment Insurance Agency provided an update on unemployment claims related to COVID-19 in Michigan. Since March 15, approximately 2.1 million eligible claimants have applied for state and federal benefits, with \$11.4 billion in benefits paid to more 2 million workers. The agency also announced that it has now cleared a majority of all accounts that were flagged for further identity verification due to criminal attacks.
- Faith based communities are now joining with Oakland County health officials to provide free COVID-19 testing. Oakland County Executive, David Coulter, knows Black Americans have been disproportionately impacted by the virus. In the county, about a third of COVID-19 cases and deaths are among African-Americans. The county has already been providing drive through testing, but this new effort will help increase the number of people who get a COVID19 test.
- After spending 94 days in the hospital, Johtasha Mosely, one of the original eight COVID-19 patients at Beaumont Hospital in Troy has been discharged home. She had been placed on a ventilator for five weeks and was near death five different times, according to doctors. Mosely had to relearn how to use her arms and legs after coming off of the ventilator due to being in bed for so long.
