SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Beaumont researchers are hopeful that a combination treatment of two common drugs—naltrexone and ketamine will lessen the severity of COVID-19 symptoms by reducing the early and later side effects of the virus. Beaumont announced that the FDA has cleared them to launch a study named, “SINK COVID-19” (Study of Immunomodulation using Naltrexone and Ketamine for COVID-19).
- According to an internal White House document obtained by the New York Times, modeling data by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) projects that the daily death toll in the U.S. will double by June 1, reaching an estimated 3,000 deaths per day.
- “Americans could be in for a bad fall and a bad winter if the country is unprepared”, said Dr. Anthony Fauci, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases. A second wave of COVID-19 is predicted to come in the fall as the previously identified four (4) common coronaviruses peak in the winter months. This is based on trends following previous outbreaks and the second wave of COVID-19 could begin at the start of flu season.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Directive [2020-5](#), creating the Michigan COVID-19 Office of Accountability within the State Budget Office. The Accountability Office will provide oversight of all spending to address this crisis, and must report regularly on its work to the governor and the state budget director.
- Governor Whitmer announced that more than \$3.3 million (USD) in financial relief is going to 657 bar and restaurant owners across the state – a financial lifeline averaging over \$5,000 (USD) for hard-hit hospitality businesses.
- Several counties across Michigan are scheduled to hold elections Tuesday, May 5. It's the first election in the state since COVID-19 was confirmed in Michigan.
