## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- An article from Johns Hopkins University of Medicine states: "To reach herd immunity for COVID-19, likely 70% or more of the population would need to be immune. Without a vaccine, over 200 million Americans would have to get infected before we reach this threshold. Put another way, even if the current pace of the COVID-19 pandemic continues in the United States – with over 25,000 confirmed cases a day – it will be well into 2021 before we reach herd immunity. If current daily death rates continue, over half a million Americans would be dead from COVID-19 by that time."
- Michigan received a delivery of 1600 vials of Remdesivir from the US government under an Emergency Use Authorization issued by the FDA. This is approximately enough for 145 critically ill patients. MDHHS developed an Interim Emergency Allocation Strategy to allow this limited supply of medication to be rapidly distributed to 41 hospitals selected under the strategy.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
  - [2020-82](#): Extending a prior order temporarily lifting regulatory requirements on hospitals and care facilities to help ensure adequate personnel and facilities to serve patients during the continuing COVID-19 pandemic.
  - [2020-83](#): Ensures the availability of child care services for health care workers, first responders, and other workers during the COVID-19 crisis.
  - [2020-84](#): Establishes procedures in long-term care facilities to protect the health and safety of both employees and residents. The order provides for standard safety protocols at nursing homes and other long-term care facilities to suppress the spread of COVID-19, keeping both residents and staff safe. It also establishes a network of "regional hubs"—nursing homes with separate units devoted exclusively to care of COVID-19-affected patients.
- The State of Michigan will participate in the federal unemployment insurance agency work share program to help offset budget implications as a result of the state's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
