## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The Wayne County Public Health Division, in partnership with Garden City Hospital, announced the opening of the COVID-19 [Save-A-Life](#) Program to the public. The program provides COVID-19 drive-up diagnostic and antibody testing for Wayne County employees, Wayne County residents, and the general public with no out-of-pocket cost or pre-scheduled appointment. The program is made possible with Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funds.
- The Michigan Economic Development Corporation announced that the Michigan Strategic Fund approved new economic assistance for small businesses, community revitalization projects and a business expansion that signals a strong beginning for economic recovery in Michigan.
- At least 14 people who visited Harper's Restaurant and Brew Pub in East Lansing between June 12 and June 20 have tested positive for COVID-19. The individuals are all between 19 and 23 years old and about half of them have a connection to Michigan State University. Health officials said anyone who visited the bar during that time period should monitor themselves for symptoms of COVID-19 as symptoms can develop for up to 14 days after exposure.
- Governor Whitmer stated in an interview that she hoped to move the rest of the state into phase 5 this week, however, recent spikes in cases have caused her to wait a bit longer before making that move.
- The drug maker, Sanofi Pasteur, has been more cautious than some of its rivals in projecting when its COVID-19 vaccines might be ready. Now, it is announcing an acceleration of clinical trials to reach the market faster — and striking a \$425 million deal to broaden its partnership with a smaller biotech company to develop one of them.

## ACTIONS TAKEN

- The Wayne County Department of Public Health has partnered with Garden City Hospital in the development of the [Save-A-Life](#) program to provide COVID-19 drive-up diagnostic and antibody testing for Wayne County employees, Wayne County residents, and the general public with no out-of-pocket cost or pre-scheduled appointment. The program also simplifies the donation of convalescent plasma for individuals with positive antibodies that wish to donate.
